So this month we will have three spotlights, one for each of the organizations housed within our American Legion Family. You will see spotlights that highlight Linda Carroll, our American Legion Auxiliary President, Clint Colie, our SAL (Sons of the American Legion) Commander and Michael Fogio, our current commander of Post 139. As all three of these amazing people are extremely busy, I was lucky enough to be able to pin down Linda first and so she will be our first spotlight for December.

I sat down with Linda on Thursday December 5th, we were able to find some quiet time before the Lyndhurst Adult Services holiday party. As an auxiliary member myself, I've gotten to know Linda over these last few years and I was pleasantly surprised to learn some interesting information about her and maybe you will be too!

Linda was born on November 24th, making her a Sagittarius, in Jersey City, NJ but raised in Ridgefield Park, NJ. She currently resides in Lyndhurst, NJ with her husband of 34 years, Mike Carroll. Now this actually shocked me! I thought Linda was a Lyndhurst lifer but in actuality she's only been here since 1992!

Linda is not only an auxiliary member like myself, however, she is currently the President of the American Legion Auxiliary Unit 139. The super short explanation, to be an auxiliary member, one must have a family member who has served (or is currently serving) in the armed forces. So when you hear some of Linda's family history, you'll clearly see that Linda comes from a military family and was destined to be a part of this organization.

Linda has family who has served in different branches of our armed forces. When looking at her mother's side of the family, her grandfather was in the Army while serving in World War II, while her uncle served his time there in the Navy. Linda has trained and worked as a beautician! She worked for a while in the hair industry before attending junior college and jumping into the world of economics and accounting! I'm sure you've noticed by now I like to end these interviews on a more fun and personal note and because I'm always curious to hear the answer to this question.
